

How to imprint your fingerprints

Materials needed:

1. A # 2 pencil or graphite and clear tape. (or Lipstick: See below)
 2. A manila envelop to send the copies of your fingerprint sheet on page 2 or a good quality scanner to send them as e-mail attachment.
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Imprinting your **fingerprint patterns**:

* **Step 1:** Use a #2 pencil (or graphite) to darken a portion of a piece of paper. Be generous with the graphite. Add more as you need it.

* **Step 2:** Rub the **upper section of each finger** (there are 3 sections) across the graphite on the paper, making sure you have covered the full upper section ~ 1/8" – 1/4" down from the very tip down to the first joint. See example below.

***Step 3:** Place a piece of clear tape onto the darkened finger; press gently capturing the entire pattern.

* **Step 4:** Carefully remove the tape from the fingertip, and stick the tape in the corresponding boxes on page 2.

(You can try **lipstick** lightly applied directly to your fingers to cover the upper section and pressed directly in the boxes indicated.)



Note: The **pinkies** are the hardest to see...so make sure you are extra careful to get the full pattern.

Place the tape of each fingerprint in corresponding box:

Right Thumb	Right Index	Right Middle	Right Ring	Right Pinky
Left Thumb	Left Index	Left Middle	Left Ring	Left Pinky

Examples: Try to get the full fingerprint pattern

Right Thumb 	Right Index	Right Middle	Right Ring	Right Pinky
Left Thumb	Left Index	Left Middle	Left Ring	Left Pinky 

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
